What is the weirdest island in the world?

There are many contenders. Here's



It's particularly weird because it MOVES about 200 metres (650 ft.) a year.

It is situated around 300 km southeast of Halifax, Nova Scotia. A narrow, crescentshaped sandbar it has a surface area of about 34 km².



The island's only inhabitants are grey seals and wild horses. Free to roam, they represent one of the world's last wild equine populations. Access to the island is controlled by Canada as a National Park, with access only from June to October.



An estimated 350 vessels are believed to have fallen victim to the island's sand bars. For this reason this place is nicknamed the Graveyard of the Atlantic.



He's both the Author and the Finisher of our faith

- ... He's the Beginning and the End...
 - ... and He's everything in between. ...
 - ... and God's friends simply find that out... act on the assumption that it's true... and let God do it!

For nine years, as Director of Training and Acting Warden of Evangelists I was privileged to spend time with groups of God's friends — people who believed that He was calling them into ministry... trying to help them discern God's will for their lives. And you can be absolutely sure that He did reveal His will for each one of them — as He did for Elijah — and will do for you.

As God said to Jacob:

"Look, I am with you, and I will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. For I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." *Genesis 28:15*)



Sometimes, God can be hard to understand — when things 'seemingly' go wrong or He says, "No!" and steers you away from what you 'think' is His will to something else that is even better. It may take some time to discover how God's plans for you are for your long-term good when all you are feeling now is confusion and frustration—and even pain.

"Lord, I want to be a computer engineer."

"Tough! I want you to be a teacher, a preacher and a writer."

"Steve—It's time for me to take your soul-mate wife Terry from you. You'll meet again in heaven, but Terry's friend, Sue, has been praying for a Christian husband—and I have chosen you. As I blessed your time with Terry, so I will bless your time with Sue. But, by the way, I'm also going to take your evangelism training role from you on the day Terry comes to me. Read Job. It will help. He's been there. He lost all that he loved in one day, too. My friend, I promise that I will be with you."

The Lord Jesus knew all about hurt and frustration when the people of His home town tried to kill Him when all He wanted to do was to teach and heal them (Luke 4:16–30).

It was the same when His family thought He was "out of His mind" (Mark 3:21) and tried to take Him away from a meeting where He was speaking... or, when His best friend betrayed Him.

Jesus knew all about the pain you feel, when you're hurt or confused.



The Cathedral is full of dinosaurs!

he Cathedral is full of dinosaurs – and no, that's not a dig at my colleagues, I hasten to add!

No, this summer, we're hosting the **Natural History Museum's Killer Question** exhibition, which explores what the famous T Rex was really like and shows what he/she and a number of other of these ancient creatures possibly looked like.

What on earth has this to do with the Cathedral's primary purposes of worship and mission you may ask. Is this just a money-making gimmick, and has the Cathedral lost its spiritual bearings?

Well let's first of all be honest enough to say that we are hoping to make quite a lot of money from the exhibition and from the thousands of visitors who come to see it. And that will be quite an important element in helping to keep the doors of the Cathedral open 365 days a year, the roof on, its staff paid and its ministry resourced. But it's not just about the money. We believe this is a real missionary opportunity.

Many people never darken the door of a Church building, of any sort, from one year to the next. Even rites of passage like weddings, funerals, christenings are becoming increasingly secularized and coming to church is no longer the norm. Events and exhibitions like this however, bring a huge number of families and young people through our door and into our extraordinary and awesome space, which dinosaurs or not, unmistakably speaks of Christ at the centre of all



that we are about. Visitors entering the West Door won't see a dinosaur they will see the great cross that hangs at the head of the nave – and the figure of Jesus whose death and resurrection is at the heart of our faith.

Our past experience, (we have hosted space capsules, moons and Gaia earth in recent years) tells us that coming to the Cathedral offers many people a chance (an excuse maybe) to connect to the faith we proclaim; to light a candle, say a prayer, have a conversation with a chaplain. It really can be a small step (perhaps the first) on the journey of faith.



And as for dinosaurs — well it also gives an opportunity to dispel some of the myths about science and religion, for example that the Church doesn't "believe" in evolution. Perhaps it will help us make the connection with the really important issues about the extinction of species, which isn't

something that only happened millions of years ago. It's happening now – and what are we planning to do about it and the big issues of bio-diversity and climate change?

Widening our imaginations, encouraging questions, attracting new people, engaging creatively with those who come, and also supporting our

mission financially. We think that's a win win! Happy holidays to those having them

Don't rely on gossip—check out the facts!



For more than twenty-five years, Dr. Thomas Shipp was pastor of a great and caring congregation that began in his living room and grew to more than eight thousand members. Although in constant demand as a speaker, he often went to small churches on preaching missions.


One Sunday evening he drove from Dallas to a small town to preach.

Some people standing around in front of the church said, "Preacher, see that house over there (next-door to the parsonage, and the church)? A woman lives there with her seventeen-year-old daughter. A man drives up at ten o'clock every night. He leaves the next morning at two-thirty."

They told Shipp that the girl was going to Kansas City and that everyone knew why she was going. She was "in trouble." Furthermore, they implied that the man who came each night was responsible.

Shipp watched.

Sure enough, at exactly ten o'clock, a man



drove up and went inside. But he was gone in the morning. Next day, almost everywhere Dr. Shipp went, people talked about this girl.

Shipp asked the local pastor: "Have you ever been over to see the family that lives next-door?"

The pastor protested, "Man, I wouldn't be caught dead in that house!"

So Shipp decided he would go himself.

Tom had a passion for reaching out to those with problems. The "othersorientation" of the church he helped found on the appropriately named Lovers Lane in Dallas was most dramatically and impactfully experienced by alcoholics and their families seeking freedom from addiction. It was said in the mid-1960's that it had the fourth largest Methodist congregation, with over 300 families of people struggling with alcoholism who had found sanctuary there. The "othersorientation" was also seen in its bold steps toward integration of people of different races in the tense civil rights driven decade of the 1960s. '

Tom introduced himself at the door

"You don't know me; I'm Tom Shipp from Dallas, Texas. I'm over here preaching in the church. I understand your daughter left town this morning. I just wanted to come by and let you know that I was thinking of you. This must be a difficult day for you. I don't even know your name, but I'm praying for you today."

The woman broke down in tears. When able to regain her composure, she explained, "I don't know what I am going to do without my daughter."

Inside the house, Tom discovered a third person, the 85-year-old grandmother. The girl's father had died some years back. So the mother and daughter had come to this

house to live with Grandma because Grandfather was also dead.

Then Grandmother suffered an illness that

demanded round-the-clock care. So the mother was completely confined to the house.

No one in the community saw her. The daughter did all the shopping.

That evening, Tom arranged for a sitter for

the grandmother so the mother could attend the revival meeting.

Tom introduced the woman to the congregation. "I want you to meet your neighbour and my new friend.

This is a great night in her life.

She lives next-door to the parsonage.

Her daughter had to leave home this morning because they no longer had food to eat, and no one in this town would give the girl a job. Therefore, the daughter has to go to another town to work and send back money for her mother's and grandmother's living.

Grandmother, who lives in the same house, is eighty-five years old and requires constant care.

Your neighbour says she doesn't know what she would do, if it weren't for her brother who drives 120 miles every night and stays with Grandma between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 2:30 a.m while my friend gets four and a half hours of sleep.

The reason this night is special to her is because it's the first time she has been back in this church since she was six years old, when her father was the founding pastor of this church!"

As Tom often said to his own congregation,

"We are here for people who need us. If we aren't here for people who need us, then why are we here?"

"Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up" (Ephesians 4:29)




