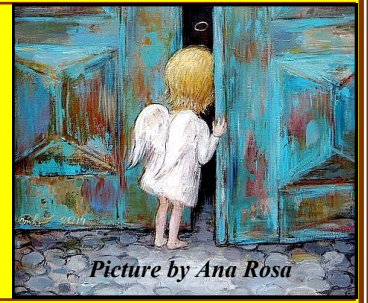


# Steve's Puzzles & Stuff—101

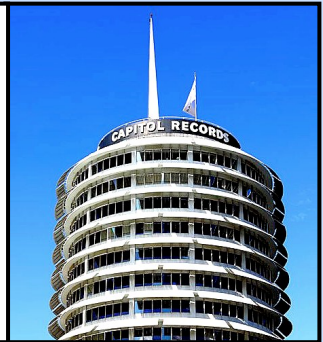
- Because of you she gets her new place next week.

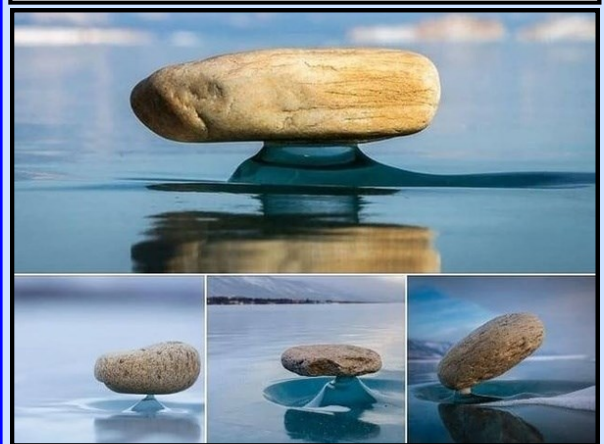

We all know the Eiffel Tower, but few really know what's on the top floor. The top floor of the tower was built, in fact, to house a secret apartment inside which only Eiffel himself could enter. The apartment is now open to the public and inside are some former possessions of Eiffel, his daughter Claire, and the inventor Thomas Edison.



These peculiar images look as though the stones are levitating on the water, and occur when the lake is covered by a thick layer of ice. The stones are first pushed onto the frozen surface of the lake by strong winds then heated by sunlight that melts the ice underneath. The part under the stone remains frozen, creating the illusion of these levitating stones.

# JIGSAW CROSS

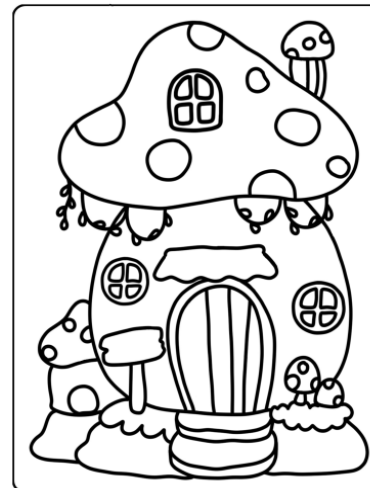

# LAST AID QUIZ!

19th Century first aid was a bit different from today.

Can you match 15 treatments from an 1815 book for young men with what they were for?

**COMPLAINTS:** Choose from: Asthma; a bruise; chilblains; colic (*abdominal gripe*); convulsions in children; a cough; cramp; deafness; diabetes; ear ache; hard breasts (*can occur in men and women*); jaundice; piles; spitting blood; worms.

1. Immediately apply treacle spread on brown paper; or rub the part with Opodeldoc (*a kind of soap lineament*) .....
2. Take a teacupful of stewed prunes, at lying down, for 2 or 3 nights. Or, two spoonfuls of nettle juice, every morning, and a large cup of decoction of nettles, at night, for a week. ....
3. Cut an ounce of stick liquorice into slices; steep this in a quart of water for 24 hours, and use it, when you are worse than usual as a common drink, which has been known to give much ease. ....
4. Apply turnips roasted till soft, then mashed and mixed with a little oil of roses: Change this twice a day, keeping the (?) very warm with flannel. ....
5. Apply a poultice of roasted onions hot: Keep it on two or three days, if not cured sooner. ....
6. Drink a quart (2 pints) of warm water. Or apply outwardly a bag of hot oats; or steep the legs in hot water a quarter of an hour. ....
7. Drink three or four times a day a quarter of a pint of alum-posset, putting three drachms of alum to four pints of milk. It seldom fails to cure in eight to ten days. ....
8. Tie your garters smooth and tight under your knee at going to bed, which seldom fails; or lay a roll of brimstone (sulphur) under your pillow. ....
9. Drink a pint of cold water lying down in bed, or make a hole through a lemon, and fill it with honey; roast it and catch the juice: take a spoonful of this frequently. ....
10. Rub the (?) hard for a quarter of an hour— or put in a roasted fig, or onion, as hot as may be— or, blow the smoke of tobacco strongly into it. ....
11. Scrape peony roots, fresh digged; apply what you have scraped off to the soles of the feet. ....
12. Apply warm treacle—or a tobacco leaf steeped in water twenty-four hours; and take flour of brimstone in treacle or milk. ....
13. Take a small pill of castile soap every morning for eight to ten days. ....
14. Take two spoonfuls of bandy sweetened with loaf-sugar every morning. ....
15. Be electrified through the... , or use the cold water bath; or wash the head in cold water every morning. ....

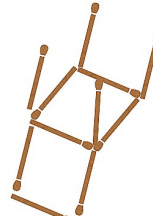

### The Vet

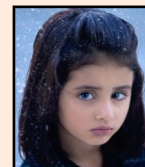

The missionary answered, "There were no men there; just my wife and I."



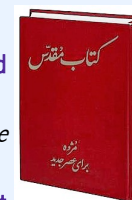
